



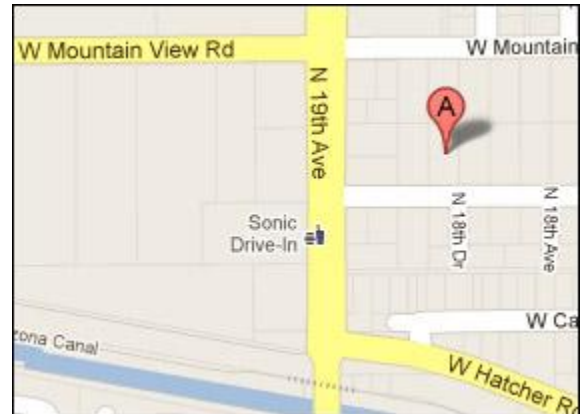

Church History

The Hungarians in Phoenix contacted the leaders of the Hungarian Reformed Church in America in 1972, namely Rt. Rev. Dezső Ábrahám, Bishop and Rev. Tibor Dömötör, Dean. The organization of the congregation was delegated to Rev. József Szirmay in order to found the local community. The first ceremony was held on August 20th, 1972 on "The Day of King Saint István" at a Presbyterian Church. The Hungarian Reformed Church in Phoenix (HRCP) operates according to the teachings of the Holy Scriptures and the Constitution, By-Laws. It strives to fulfill the spiritual and cultural needs of the local Hungarian community.



SERVICES

Services held every Sunday at 11 AM followed by a coffee and pastry social provided by the Woman's Guild of the Congregation.

On the first Tuesday of every month we hold a fellowship day from 9 AM where socializing with games, music, sometimes showing of old Hungarian movies makes for a wonderful cultural gathering.

Regular activities include the Dinner dance where the cost is donated by church members and friends that give support for cultural national and spiritual needs of our congregation.
